Greetings! It has been another great year at Weber Human Services (WHS) and Weber Human Services Foundation. We appreciate all our board members and the time they spend working in the Foundation for our clients. We are also appreciative of our partner organizations in the community who work alongside and with us to provide unmatched services in Weber and Morgan Counties.

As we look toward the future, it is important to celebrate the meaningful, life-changing work happening for the clients at WHS. The Foundation is proud to support the work being done across the agency. Recently, in the Mental Health Department, the Family Recovery Court held a graduation celebration, provided by the Foundation, where the agency celebrated five graduates. One of them has been in treatment for three years and has had significant challenges along the way. Early in the treatment process, the client's newborn baby and her older child were removed from the mother's care. After some time in treatment, the client was able to get back into the residential program, and connected with mental health and substance use services. The client is now maintaining her own residence, has her two children back in her care, and is doing better than she has ever done before. The Foundation provides funding for incentives that help clients stay motivated to complete their rehabilitation program in the Mental Health and Substance Use Departments. The funding also allows therapists to purchase items for use in the residential programs to implement skills that help with client rehabilitation programs.

The same client was able to get involved with the Supported Employment program at WHS which helped her find and maintain employment. The Supported Employment program has consistently earned recognition as being one of the most effective in job placements in Utah, and recognized nationally for the work being done to help clients maintain employment after completing treatment. The Foundation provides ongoing funding for "Lunch and Learns" to attract new business partners who will hire WHS clients looking for work. The Foundation also provides funding to Supported Employment to help clients with a portion of enrollment fees for those who wish to further their education at the ATC or Weber State University, food handler's permits, and assistance with obtaining a Driver's License or other identification.

In the Senior Services Department, there have been strides made this year with a variety of different programs. Many senior citizens are on a fixed income, do not have dental insurance, and are in need of basic dental care. The Senior Dental Assistance Program within the Foundation paid for 13 clients to receive exams, x-rays, cleanings, cavities filled, and dentures. The Senior Companion Program (SCP) had an increase in the number of volunteers and hours worked during the 2023 and 2024. To date, 41 individuals volunteered and have worked a total of 24,238 hours. The clients are happy and the majority of the individuals surveyed agree that the SCP has improved their satisfaction in life. The Foundation continues to support the SCP paying for training fees, supplies, and venue rental fees to host trainings and appreciation luncheons. In the last year, Foster Grandparent tutors served 36,370 hours, and RSVP volunteers served 81,403 hours working at non-profit and health care organizations. The Foundation provided funding used for recruiting and training volunteers in these programs along with funding for speakers presenting to attendees at in-service trainings.

Along with the work being done on behalf of the clients, the administration at WHS is in the planning process to enhance and restore the main building and other buildings being used by the agency. While all the buildings are aged, time and money are invested to make sure that the buildings are well-maintained, presentable, and functional.

One enhancement planned is the Physical/Behavioral Health Clinic. It was created with a bare bones infrastructure and has functioned well. While we will not be expanding the square footage, we will reorganize the layout. Our plans to remodel buildings at WHS will allow us to move business processes out of the main building while, at the same time, allowing for growth in clinical capacity for all WHS clinical teams.

Another change planned is the Nutrition Kitchen. It is being renovated to ensure safety of the building in the event of an earthquake. The services provided by the Nutrition Kitchen are vital to so many residents of Weber and Morgan counties - we provide in excess of 600 meals daily to the elderly and other vulnerable populations. The renovation will increase functionality and provide a safer environment for everyone.

Foundation Help for Medicare Client



It is heartwarming to hear stories of success with clients at Weber Human Services. Recently, a 51-year-old male was incarcerated for six months, and he was on Medicare. The prescription portion of Medicare is suspended when a person is incarcerated. The client was unable to get on to a Part D plan that included prescriptions until his incarceration was updated in his file. He needed to contact Social Security to make that happen.

The case worker at Weber Human Services worked with the client to contact Social Security. "It takes time to get the process done, and in the meantime he needed some medications that he could not be without due to a mental health condition," said Shantel Clark, Aging Program Manager.

The Foundation provided funding for the needed medication, which helped him maintain his mental health while the situation with his incarceration status was being updated. "It is so nice to see clients receiving help from the Foundation in situations like this. It helps the client stay focused on healing," Clark said.

Residential Facilities Offer Hope

Weber Human Services has two residential treatment facilities to help men and women work on their substance use disorders and mental health. Tranquility Home (TH) treats women, and Stepping Stones is the Men's Residential program.

TH is a 16-bed, home-like facility for women and their children with a safe and therapeutic environment in which staff and clients work together toward the goal of recovery. "Clients are connected with services including, Peer Support, Case Management, physical and mental health teams, and our youth team," said Lori Larsen, Residential Manager at TH.

"At Stepping Stones, we provide a supportive environment for men facing substance use and mental health challenges," said Tyler Larsen, Residential Manager at Stepping Stones. "We do our best to implement a safe recovery environment where clients can grow in their recovery."

One of our clients fully embraced the resources available to him during his stay at Stepping Stones. Through participation in the residential recovery program, the client was able to save money, build a stable routine, and become involved in the recovery community. "The client secured a position where he's not only thriving personally, but also contributing to elevating the organization within the recovery scene," said Larsen.

The teams at Weber Human Services working at Tranquility Home and Stepping Stones continue to emphasize teaching clients the essential tools they need for lasting change, while following structured guidelines that promote accountability and growth.

Seniors Get Out to the Movies

Raegina is new to the program, having enrolled in the last six months. "Being a senior companion is one of the biggest changes she has made for the better in her life, switching the focus from herself to serving others," says Heidi Wade, Director of the Senior Companion Program.

"I love being a Senior Companion. It makes me feel good to do things for other people. My family is so proud of me," said Raegina. Volunteers are energetic and enthusiastic about the SCP and the purpose it provides in their lives.

"Oh, the Places You'll Go!"

Weber Human Services Foundation was invited to join United Way of Northern Utah in the Read Across America program. Volunteers from Weber Human Services and the Foundation participated on Friday, March 1, 2024 at Odyssey Elementary School. "Weber Human Services Foundation board is dedicated to community service. One of our initiatives involves collaborating with United Way of Northern Utah," said Paul Miner, Foundation Board Treasurer. "This year, I enthusiastically chose to read the tongue-twisting book 'Fox in Sox' by Dr. Seuss. The first-grade students were eager to share their thoughts and engage in conversation as I read aloud from one of my favorite children's books. It was both enjoyable and rewarding to witness the impact of investing in the younger generation."

The service project lasted approximately two hours, and many people from the local community attended to be part of the event. "There is something magical about watching a child's face while reading to them," said Roger Brunner, Foundation Board member. "You can see them trying to anticipate what will happen next, trying to guess the next rhyming word, laughing at the outlandish illustrations, and learning some great life lessons through the fantasy world of Dr. Seuss!"
